Tai Ceredigion given a ministerial approval at their launch



Deputy Housing and Regeneration Minister Jocelyn Davies AM joined Tai Ceredigion's tenants, board members, and staff to celebrate the official launch of the housing association on Thursday 18th March at Theatr Felinfach, near Lampeter.

Nearly one hundred and fifty people attended the function where guests included local councilors and representatives from major statutory bodies, voluntary organisations and the Welsh Assembly Government.

Deputy Housing and Regeneration Minister Jocelyn Davies AM said "Tai Ceredigion is a wonderful example of how transferring homes to housing associations can release extra capital and bring each and every home to the

Welsh Housing Quality Standard. Furthermore the work being undertaken to these homes will mean good job and training opportunities to local people. I wish Tai Ceredigion and all their tenants well for the future.”

Steve Jones, Chief Executive of Tai Ceredigion said “Tai Ceredigion has been set up with the vision to be a first class bilingual landlord and employer that puts tenants first, provides quality homes and benefits communities and the local economy. We are thrilled that the Deputy Minister has come today to join us at our official launch and to hear about our vision of how we propose to deliver quality services for our tenants and leaseholders, as well as assisting the County Council to regenerate local communities and sustain local employment.”

Over the next 5 years, Tai Ceredigion will bring tenants homes up to the Welsh Housing Quality Standard (WHQS) by investing £40 million in the first five years, and £136 million over thirty years to maintain them at that standard.
